

American non-profits join hands with Tuvaluan delegation to unite with Pacific leaders of 28 nations at the 13th Festival of Pacific Arts and Culture in the spirit of fatele and environmental guardianship.

April 15, 2024 - Honolulu Hawai'i - In the presence of local Tuvaluan community leaders, the ATAYAL Organization reached an agreement of understanding with Siliva Timoteo, the High Chief of Nukulaelae Atoll in the Pacific Nation of Tuvalu. The purpose of the agreement is to provide support for a delegation of culture-keepers and governmental representatives from Nukulaelae to join the Tuvaluan national delegation at the 13th Festival of the Pacific Arts and Culture (FestPAC) in Hawai'i and to present Nukulaelae's own distinct voice and culture at the festivities. In addition to participating in FestPAC activities, the Tuvaluan delegation will join representatives of the ATAYAL organization plans to launch youth participation in the Indigenous Bridges Youth Ambassador Program (IBYAP), gaining access to the life-changing education and problem-solving training for global Indigenous youth as they tackle serious issues, such as rising sea levels and language and culture loss.

The 13th Festival of the Pacific Arts and Culture in Oahu, Hawai'i is the largest event for indigenous Pacific Islanders, with more than 2,500 participants from 28 nations. The event will cover many of the critical issues facing Pacific nations, including rising sea levels, climate change, destruction of coral reefs, sustainability and the increase in social inequality. It is critical for representation and inclusion of all Pacific communities, especially the most vulnerable communities in Tuvalu, when dealing with these shared existential crises. The ATAYAL organization supporters and partners have the opportunity to assist Pacific island communities that lack financial resources to lend their voice and join the fight. Also, without a larger delegation, the Tuvuluan delegation will lack the ability to truly share their culture and spirit

The current Ambassador and former Prime Minister of Tuvalu, Bikenibeu Paeniu, who had engaged with AYATAL for some time, stated, "Without a delegation of at least 40-60 members of the Tuvaluan community, the dancing troupe will not be able to convey the true spirit of the 'fatele,' the traditional community song and dance. So, we appreciate any support to bring our spirit to join our Austronesian brothers and sisters in Hawaii."





The ATAYAL Organization plans to host the Tuvaluan guests in Oahu during their participation in FestPAC to formally introduce the Indigenous Bridges Youth Ambassador Program with the Tuvaluan youth. Being a bridge to resource partners, the organization will also introduce the Tuvaluan delegation to Professor Alan Tratner, Chairman of the Green2Gold organization, a green technology incubator. Working together, ATAYAL and Green2Gold have expansive networks positioned to empower Pacific Island leaders to defend their communities from culture loss, climate change, and social inequality.



Leiven Hwang, the ATAYAL organization's Regional Director of Hawai'i, expressed his appreciation for the opportunity to support Tuvaluan youth at FestPAC by stating, "It is truly an honor to have an opportunity to engage with and learn more about the participating the Tuvaluan youth, to be a part of and contribute to their journey, and to connect with and be steeped in the wisdom and ways of the vibrant, regenerative spirit of all the Austronesian people of the Pacific."
